1. Action points From last meeting

2. Treasurer's Report

- It was suggested that BCFCSA could make a donation to Cai Owen, and organise a collection at an upcoming home game. The meeting agreed that BCFCSA would make a donation to Cai Owen and also organise a collection.

- Luke Purcell suggested that the club could organise a vote on a tune to be played when City come out onto the pitch. Luke also asked if the meeting had any suggestions about half-time entertainment. It was suggested that presenting members of the 2007-9 cup winning team to the crowd at the Welsh Cup game against Penydarren on Sunday 4 March (2.30pm) could go down well – the club will coordinate this.
